NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

As Midtown Assistance Center (MAC) approaches its 40th anniversary, we find ourselves reflecting—not just on the numbers, but on the people, the partnerships, and the unwavering spirit of service that brought us here. What began in 1986 as a small but mighty collaboration among Atlanta congregations has blossomed into a citywide community of volunteers, donors, and advocates working together to prevent hunger and homelessness.

Over these four decades, MAC has provided more than \$13.6 million in direct assistance to our neighbors in crisis. If you're holding this letter, chances are you've played a part in that story. Thank you.

Yes, the needs are growing. But so is our belief in what's possible—when we come together. As President Jimmy Carter so beautifully reminded us, “Our greatest blessings come when we are able to improve the lives of others.” With your continued support, we step boldly into our next chapter.

Anyone who has done grocery shopping in the past 6 months has felt sticker shock. Rental rates and food prices for some basic items like eggs, beef, and pork continue to soar while wages remain stagnant. Not only are families struggling to pay their rent and utilities and purchase basic items, but organizations like MAC are also spending more money to keep families housed and food pantry shelves stocked.

You've probably heard the saying, “Don't put all your eggs in one basket.” At MAC, we take that to heart. We've worked hard to build a diverse mix of funding sources so we can stay steady—even when times are uncertain. This approach has helped us weather economic ups and downs and still be there for neighbors in need.

Thanks to a balanced funding model—where no single source makes up more than 32% of our revenue—MAC entered this period of economic uncertainty from a place of stability. In addition to direct funding cuts, the ripple effects from reductions to key programs we rely on are significant—and growing.

As resources tighten across the nonprofit sector, it's becoming harder to keep our pantry shelves stocked and support families on the brink of eviction. The need in our community is rising, and so is the strain on the systems designed to help.



Meeting the moment requires continued investment from those who believe in our mission. As we look ahead to our 40th anniversary, we're not just marking a milestone—we're celebrating a movement. Forty years of neighbors helping neighbors. Forty years of faith, generosity, and action. And we want you right there with us. Here are some concrete ways you can support MAC's work.

- **Make a Financial Contribution to MAC** – 90% of the funds donated to MAC are used to fund our program services – paying overdue rent and utility bills to prevent eviction and disconnection, stocking the food pantry, providing transportation and uniform items.
- **Host a Food Drive or Purchase Items** – MAC's client choice food pantry is kept stocked with the basic food and hygiene items requested by our neighbors.
- **Volunteer** – MAC relies upon a dedicated group of volunteers who served more than 6,200 hours in the last fiscal year. Volunteers are crucial to MAC's mission and ability reach as many neighbors as possible.

Whether you've walked alongside us for decades or are just learning about our work, there's a place for you in this next chapter. Your support—through donations, food drives, volunteer time, or simply spreading the word—makes it possible for us to meet urgent needs and build lasting stability for our neighbors.

Join us as we honor the past and shape the future. Let's make MAC's 40th anniversary not just a celebration of what we've done, but a launchpad for what's next.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I am pleased to share with you Midtown Assistance Center's annual report. This year's theme is "Counting Down to Forty", which honors 39 incredible years serving the Atlanta community by preventing homelessness and hunger. Founded on the All Saints Episcopal Church block in 1986, MAC has consistently delivered for almost four decades, offering rent, food, clothing, transportation, and utility assistance to our neighbors in need in ten zip codes.

Our 38th year represented a challenging time to help Atlantans in need. 
